



YWCA Dayton operates the <u>only</u> domestic violence shelters and rape crisis centers in Montgomery & Preble counties.





Continued onsite testing, offered multiple vaccination clinics & extended safety protocols resulting in **only 5 COVID-positive clients in shelter**.

Continued **survivor support groups**, even virtually, and sent 36 care packages to prevent isolation.

Expanded Gem City Safe Bars, a bystander intervention initiative, with 6 businesses receiving 18 hours of training





Partnered with Kroger to include hotline resources at every Little Clinic in the Greater Cincinnati region.

Provided 4,100 hours of field placement supervision to 20 interns, the most in the past seven years, and one of the only nonprofits offering onsite internships during COVID-19.

YWCA Dayton has housed women since 1870, from widows in the 1880s to young professionals in the 1940s.








Girls LEAD! (Leadership, Education, Activism, Development) inspires all girls to grow in **strength**, **courage**, **and wisdom** by providing in-school peer groups and after-school workshops that address the unique issues girls face.

Aimed at engaging men and boys in ending violence against women and girls, AMEND Together seeks to challenge the culture that supports violence, cultivate healthy masculinity, and change the future, making Dayton the safest city in the country for women and girls.

2021 ACHIEVEMENTS

Overall participation increased by 190%



- 2 summer camps held in June & July using both virtual & in-person modalities
- **910 youth served** (including those living in our domestic violence shelters)
- 6 schools, including Kettering Middle School and Miamisburg Middle School
- 5+ recurring education partners, including Dayton Public Schools, Junior League of Dayton, Boy Scouts, Dayton Metro Library and Girls on the Run






