

YWCA Dayton operates the only domestic violence shelters and rape crisis centers in Montgomery & Preble counties.

- 538 clients served, including 164 children
- 100% of shelter clients reported feeling more in control of their life since entering shelter
- 100% of shelter clients reported that shelter staff are caring and supportive and treat them with respect

HOUSING PROGRAMS

2022 SERVICES

YWCA Dayton operated three housing programs in 2022.


Rapid Rehousing: For individuals and families who don't need intensive supports to quickly exit homelessness and return to permanent housing. Rent can be covered for up to a year while clients build self-sufficiency.

Permanent supportive housing: 65 apartments for women who have experienced chronic homelessness and mental illness. Rent is subsidized and residents can access extra support like onsite case management.

HomeShare/Scattered Site Housing: Two-year transitional housing and supportive services. Women and their children who are survivors of domestic violence and/or sexual assault live in a shared home while they achieve safety and stability.

Program expanded to Preble in 2020.

HELPING TO HEAL

A YW clinical care manager worked with residents who live in our permanent supportive housing to make individualized calming toolkits. Residents each identified strategies and tools that would be personally helpful for coping with life's stressors. Each item in the kit (such as playdough or a mini journal) has a specific purpose to practice mindfulness, to give sensory input, or to refocus the body and brain.





RESIDENT & SHELTER CLIENT VOTING OUTREACH



YWCA Dayton hosted a Get Out the Vote rally for women in our domestic violence shelters and permanent supportive housing.

Many survivors of domestic violence, sexual violence, or human trafficking don't want to register to vote because they want to keep their address confidential for safety reasons.

At the rally, YW staff promoted Ohio's <u>Safe at Home</u> program. This confidential voter registration program helps survivors of abuse safely register to vote by receiving a substitute address on their voter registration forms and on official records.


