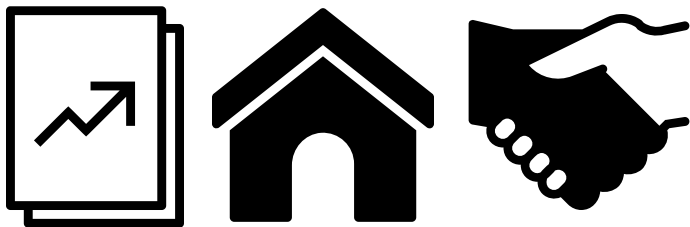

YWCA Dayton operates the only domestic violence shelters and rape crisis centers in Montgomery & Preble counties.

- ✓ **772 clients** served

- ✓ **Approved by Ohio Alliance to End Sexual Violence** as Rape Crisis Center
- ✓ **Established 4 sexual assault support groups**, 3 with community partners

Formed first-ever Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) in Preble County to provide an integrated, community-wide response for survivors

Launched behavioral health program to provide mental health and drug/alcohol counseling to survivors while in shelter

Provided 300+ hours of field placement supervision across 5 departments to students from 5 colleges and universities

YWCA Dayton has housed women since 1870, from widows in the 1880s to young professionals in the 1940s.



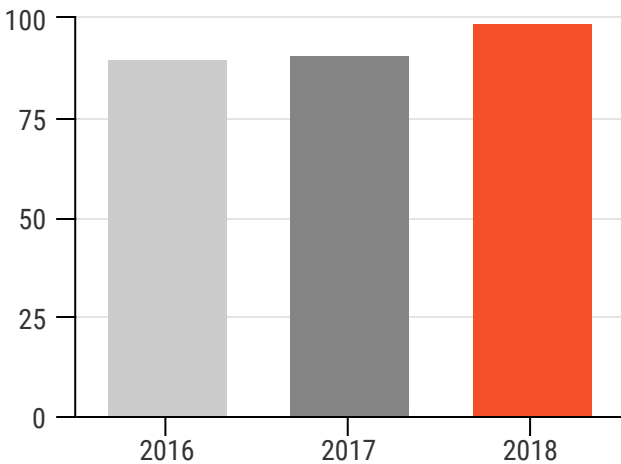
105 individuals and 31 households were helped by YW housing programs

Our housing programs serve as a bridge over the complex barriers of poverty, lack of education, and isolation. In 2017, YW staff arranged **30 groups & activities** featuring **20 community partners** that more than **150 women and children attended** (including clients from our DV shelter).

GIRLS LEAD! MISSION

Girls LEAD! (Leadership, Education, Activism, Development) inspires all girls to grow in **strength, courage, and wisdom** by providing in-school peer groups and after-school workshops that address the unique issues girls face.



46 girls received **summer camp scholarships**

Girls LEAD! builds life skills to set and achieve goals and increase resilience in the face of obstacles (like the ones below) so girls live productive and fulfilling lives.

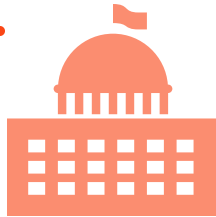

Mission-Impact Focus Area

This year, our Advocacy Committee identified a new Mission-Impact Focus Area: the political marginalization of women of color. They are the voting block who votes the most but are represented the least in political office and public policy.

According to the **2018 YWCA USA "What Women Want"** report, which details the policy priorities of women of color, more than 2/3 of women believe the issues YWCA is focused on are *very relevant* for women and girls today.

- Women of color make up 15.4% of all women in Montgomery County, but just 4% of elected officials identified as women of color in 2018.
- Black women make up 6% of the U.S. population, but hold just 3% of seats in the U.S. Congress.
- In state legislatures, Black women hold 3% of seats and only 2 Black women in the country hold statewide elected office.

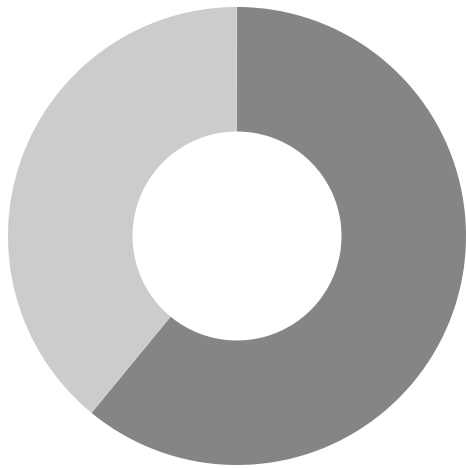

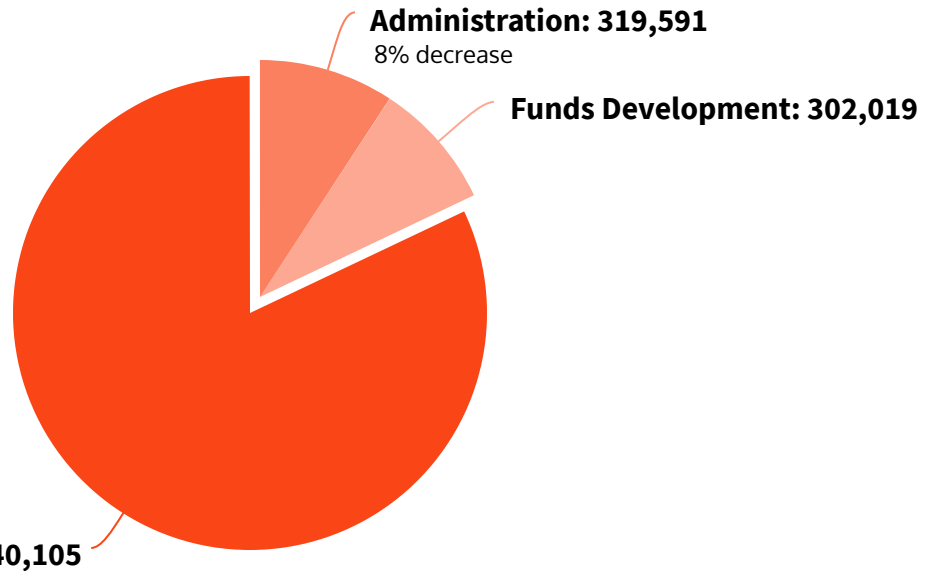
